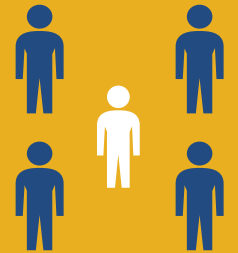


HAZING ON COLLEGE CAMPUSES



9 of 10

students who have experienced hazing do not consider themselves hazed



Hazing is considered any action taken or any situation created intentionally that causes embarrassment, harassment or ridicule and risks emotional and/or physical harm to members of a group or team, whether new or not, regardless of the person's willingness to participate.



25% of hazing incidents involve the presence of alumni.



47% of students are hazed before they enter college.



82% of hazing deaths in college involve alcohol.

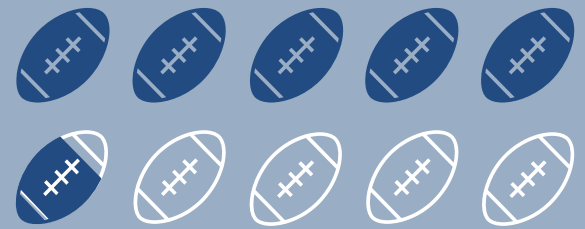
Who is affected by hazing?

6 Common Hazing Practices:

- Alcohol consumption
- Humiliation
- Sleep deprivation
- Beating and paddling
- Sexual acts
- Illegal activities
